Each day, 780,000 police officers across our country put a badge on and go to work knowing the situations they may face are extremely dangerous.

On average, between 105 and 203 officers die in the line of duty, 50,000 officers are assaulted in the line of duty, 14,000 officers are injured in the line of duty, and over 300 officers commit suicide each year. There is no other profession in the world, except possibly the military, where you will find these kinds of statistics.

In 2017, 125 law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty. In Tennessee, 2 officers lost their lives in the line of duty in 2017. This total has decreased since 2016; there were 6 officers killed in the line of duty in Tennessee.

The Hendersonville FOP Lodge 63 Officers Fund provides funds to be dispersed to a law enforcement officer of Sumner County, Tennessee. The Officers Fund covers serious illnesses and injuries that prevent the officer from performing his/her job duties as a law enforcement officer. The Officers Fund also takes care of officers that suffer a serious injury outside of his/her normal duties.



There are approximately 500 officers working in Sumner County, Tennessee. These officers come from cities like Portland, White House, Westmoreland, Hendersonville, Gallatin, Goodlettsville, Sumner County Sheriff's Office, and Tennessee Highway Patrol.

The Hendersonville FOP Lodge 63 officers fund is used for officers in Sumner County Tennessee.
